Subject: Climate Action Plan and Sustainability Programs Update

Recommendation

This report is provided for informational purposes. Staff will provide a brief presentation to accompany this report that will also include information on FY 2015-16 programs.

Background

The City continued to make significant progress over the past year in support of its Climate Action Plan and Sustainability programs. The following list reflects recent key accomplishments:

1) Secured \$92K Competitive Beverage Container Recycling Grant

- a. One of only two cities statewide to receive this grant.
- Program partners are New Leaf, Martinez Unified School District (MUSD), Republic Services, and Sea Scouts.
- c. Funding allocated to support MUSD recycling program development and implementation and new recycling receptacles for City parks and downtown core.
- 2) <u>Initiated and secured the City's second year of participation in the California Youth</u> <u>Energy Services Program provided by Rising Sun Energy Center</u>
 - a. Program provided a paid workforce training and development opportunity for 9 Martinez youth and served 248 Martinez residences with free energy and water conservation assessments, infrastructure, and installation services.
 - b. Major funding and in-kind support secured from program partners Republic Services (\$5K), and MUSD (office space, equipment and workstations).

3) Initiated Organics Recycling Collection Review

- a. Introduced to Council April 2015 (unanimous support).
- b. Public hearing to adopt findings and recommendations November 4, 2015.
 - i. Proposed residential commencement January 1, 2016.
 - ii. Proposed Commercial/Industrial commencement April 1, 2016.
- 4) <u>Initiated Participation in Cool California Challenge</u> The City enrolled as one of only 22 cities statewide and 4 in Contra Costa County in the competition to determine "California's Coolest City." Residents register at <u>www.CAChallenge.org</u> to track and reduce household energy use and vehicle miles traveled to earn points for Martinez.

- 5) <u>Produced and Developed Special Water Conservation Educational Workshop</u>
 - a. Water Conservation Essentials: Every Drop Counts held in July 2015 in response to severe drought; playback to air in three segments on City Channel.
- 6) <u>Upgraded Amtrak Electric Vehicle Charging Station</u> Completed upgrade to dual port station at Amtrak in July 2015 to enable simultaneous charging of two users. EV users now have 4 options for Level 2 fast charge in downtown Martinez: City Hall (single port), corner of Main/Court street (single port), and Amtrak (dual port). Downtown usage:
 - a. FY 14-15: 1,150 sessions, 6,755 Kg GHG savings, \$2,197 in revenue.
 - b. FY 15-16 (July-October): 572 sessions, 1,793 Kg GHG savings, \$1,211 in revenue.
- 7) Continued Plastic Bag and Styrofoam Ban Public Outreach and Education
 - a. Distributed more reusable bags, reminder decals and educational materials.
 - b. Conducted spot audits at various shopping districts; high rates of compliance.
- 8) <u>Hosted Earth Day Booth</u> The City hosted a booth for the 7th consecutive year with information on the City's sustainability programs during the April 2015 Earth Day celebration.
- 9) <u>Hosted Numerous Free Workshops</u> Held 4 more free workshops in FY 2014-15; over 325 citizens have received special sustainability/conservation training since 2009-10.
