

## POLICE BLOTTER FOR MAR. 1-15, 2018



### 3/1

- At 8:00 am Commanders Ghisletta and Roth observed a female urinating in the park on Brown Street. Upon contacting her, she struck Commander Ghisletta on the chest. Officers arrived and the female was secured in the WRAP restraint device, at which time she spat on Officer Winslett.
