Subject: Martinez Trust Lands Use Plan

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MARTINEZ – The Martinez Trust Lands Use Plan is a state-mandated document that describes the City’s existing and proposed uses for 68 acres of contiguous waterfront and submerged lands that include the Martinez Marina, the Bait Shop, Eagle Marine, the Martinez Yacht Club, the Dog Park, the Amphitheater, and the Sea Scouts building, plus a 12-acre parcel that contains a railway. The attached maps identify the project area. The State granted these lands to Martinez on the condition that they are preserved for use and enjoyment by the public. This can be accomplished through several means, including protection of maritime commerce, fisheries, open space, wildlife habitat, and water-oriented recreation.

The City is holding a community meeting on July 24, 2019 at City Hall, 525 Henrietta Street, Martinez at 7:00 p.m. to gather input from the community on existing and future uses of these lands. The draft plan will be reviewed by the City’s Parks, Recreation, Marina and Cultural Commission in August, and by the Planning Commission and City Council in the fall. The City intends to embark on a comprehensive master plan for the entire waterfront area in 2020. The Trust Lands Use Plan is a first step in the planning process for this area.
