

POLICE BLOTTER FOR NOV. 1-15, 2019



On November 1st at 10:22 pm, officers located an unsecured front door to building A at the Junior High School. When opened, the alarm activated. We had not received any alarms earlier. The interior was checked (both floors) and no one was located inside. There were no signs of theft or any other crime. There were no responders, but officers were able to secure the building. Incident 1911010090.

At 12:05 am, Sergeant Busciglio was conducting foot patrol on Main St. when he was contacted by a transient in the plaza. The man had a saxophone that was given to him earlier by another transient and was told to give it to the police. The man who contacted Sgt. Busciglio knew it was stolen. The saxophone was recovered and its serial number appeared to be filed off. It seems to be the Yamaha saxophone stolen from the Junior High School back in September. The saxophone was recovered and logged into evidence. A supplement report was taken and forwarded to investigations in the original burglary case, case# 19-2421.

At 10:20 am, a Parole Agent was looking for a 28-year-old man from Richmond. The man had walked away from the drug treatment facility on Pacheco Blvd., and the agent wanted to place a hold on him. Corporal Mayberry located the man on Pacheco Blvd. approximately 20 minutes later. The man was booked into MDF for the 3056 PC (parole hold). Case# 19-2963.

At 10:57 pm, officers responded to the Martinez marina for a report of a fire. Upon arrival, a boat tied to the launch ramp pier (east pier) was fully engulfed in flames. A man from Richmond stated he owns the boat. He was on the boat with his girlfriend and the boat caught on fire while they were sleeping. They jumped out

and their dog was believed to not have been able to get off. There was no obvious evidence of any foul play. The boat burned into the water and the pier did not appear to be damaged and or burned. A Contra Costa County Arson investigator responded to the scene. A city corporation yard employee responded and the pier was barricaded off. City employees will return in the morning to remove the boat from the water during daylight. Water booms were wrapped around the boat to contain any chemicals. MPD case# 19-3067.
