

POLICE BLOTTER FOR MAY 1-15, 2020



- On May 1st at 12:01 am, Officer Parsons responded to a house fire in the 1500 block of Windwood Drive. The fire was in the attic and cause is unknown. Handled by Confire.
- At 5:10 am, Officer Lekse was dispatched to the 3600 block of Pine Street for a theft that just occurred. The caller heard glass break from the area of the maintenance building. The caller walked to the area and saw two suspects flee with tools in their hands to a vehicle. The caller also discovered that her daughter's car (2014 Honda # 7GPR89) had been stolen from the parking lot.
