

POLICE BLOTTER FOR OCT. 1-15, 2020



On October 2nd at 9:58 pm, Officer Green was on patrol near Fountainhead Court. His LPR camera alerted him to a "stolen vehicle" hit on lic#6AQD447. The vehicle was unoccupied. The vehicle was confirmed stolen out of Sacramento PD. SPD requested MPD not to process the vehicle, they will have an evidence tech. respond to the tow yard since the vehicle was taken as a result of a residential burglary in their jurisdiction. Case 20-2104.

At 6:40 am, Officer Buda responded to the John Muir Inn for a stolen vehicle report. The victim reported her 2004 GMC Denali was stolen within the past 30 minutes. At approximately 9:30 am, Officer Buda located the vehicle parked unoccupied on westbound SR4 underneath the Pine St. overcrossing. Both license plates and headlamps had been removed. Case 20-2106.

At 4:30 pm, officers responded to the 1100 block of Arnold Dr. for a welfare check of a subject. Officers contacted a 68-year-old man from Martinez. The man was arrested for possession of heroin. He was cite released for the drugs. Officer Wah, case 20-2111.

At 2:19 am, Officer Green was conducting a routine security check at the Nob Hill Shopping Center, when his attention was directed to a trailer with a jet ski parked near John Muir Inn. He conducted a records check on both the trailer and jet ski, and both were reported stolen to Concord PD. Case 20-2114.

At 2:32 am, officers responded to the area of 795 Shell Ave. for a report of a vehicle collision. Upon arrival, officers contacted a 23-year-old man from Martinez in his vehicle. The vehicle was off the road and down the hillside. There were no other vehicles identified to being involved in the collision. After contacting the man, the officers initiated a DUI investigation. At the conclusion of the DUI investigation, the man was placed under arrest for CVC 23152(A)/(B) and transported to MPD for evidence collection. He was released from MPD.

At 3:40 am, officers were dispatched to the 800 block of Arnold Dr. for a report of a vehicle on fire. Officer Green arrived and confirmed the vehicle was fully engulfed. Once Con Fire arrived and dealt with the fire suppression, it was identified the vehicle was traveling W/B on SR4, drove off the highway, tore down approximately 100 feet of fence and rested facing E/B on Arnold Drive. After the fire was distinguished, CHP was notified of the fatal collision. Martinez Corp Yard personnel were requested to place barricades on Arnold at Old Orchard and on Arnold at Howe Road.

A truck was seen driving on the baseball fields and park at Morello Elementary School last night causing significant damage. The truck was recognized and the suspect was identified. The suspect is paying for the damages. Case 20-2117.

At 10:00 am, a solo CHP officer was in pursuit of a felony vehicle westbound SR-4 through Martinez. The suspect vehicle was occupied by four suspects. One of the occupants was armed with an AK-47 and the other a knife. MPD units did not participate in the pursuit;

however, our officers did arrive on scene at the McEwen off-ramp where the vehicle crashed. One suspect was arrested in the vehicle, but the others fled on foot. Officer Buda was able to detain one of the other suspects a short distance away. A perimeter was established and one other suspect was apprehended, but the fourth avoided capture. The AK-47 was recovered in the vehicle.

At 7:55 p.m., Officer Parsons located an unoccupied stolen vehicle, via LPR, in the 3900 block of Alhambra Avenue. Case 20-2124.

At 1:09 a.m., Officer Williamson initiated a traffic enforcement stop near the John Muir Inn. The male driver was arrested for warrants. Case 20-2125.

The subject was entered into MUPS (Missing Unidentified Persons System) and a county wide BOLO (Be On The Look Out) was issued. Later in the shift the officers located the subject driving his vehicle on Alhambra Avenue. Officers stopped the subject and he was found to be lost and disoriented. He was removed from MUPS and reunited with his family. Case 20-2161.

Officer Weems conducted an enforcement stop on an off-road mini motorcycle in the 1100 block of Arnold Drive. The driver was contacted and was exhibiting signs of being under the influence. A subsequent search revealed 39.7 grams of methamphetamine packaged separately on his person. He was arrested for the transportation and possession for sales of a dangerous drugs; booked at MPD and cite released. Case 20-2164.

At 9:30 am, Officer Mayberry observed a vehicle driving in a reckless manner downtown. The driver was speeding, failing to stop at stop signs, and passing other motorists on the wrong side of the roadway. Officer Mayberry stopped the vehicle and arrested the driver for reckless driving. Cite released and vehicle towed. Case 20-2165.

At 12:45 pm, officers were dispatched to the area of Nob Hill for a subject swinging a golf club at a motorcyclist. The victim reported the suspect jumped in front of his motorcycle and began to swing the club at him. He was not struck and the suspect fled. Officer Mayberry contacted the suspect a short time later and he was identified as an individual from Pasadena; he was arrested for felony Assault with a Deadly Weapon and booked into MDF.
