

## POLICE BLOTTER FOR SEPT. 1-15, 2020



- On September 1<sup>st</sup> at 7:44 am, Corporal Schnabel took a vehicle burglary report at the John Muir Inn. Approximately \$3,000 in lineman tools were stolen. Case 20-1867.
- At 5:05 pm, Officer Miller responded to the courthouse on Pine Street for a dumpster fire. Surveillance showed that a suspect with a black hooded sweatshirt caused the fire. Case 20-1870.

An interior check of suite B was conducted and it was discovered that subjects attempted to gain entry into Velvet through a connected glass door, but were only able to break one pane of the door; the second pane remained intact. Dispatch was unable to identify a responder to Power Endurance. The Corp Yard was contacted to secure the front door. Velvet did not appear to be compromised.
- Officer Buda responded to the 700 block of Center Avenue on a report of a suspicious vehicle in the parking lot of the housing complex. A records check revealed the vehicle to have been reported stolen out of Concord. The registered owner of the vehicle was contacted and responded to the scene to retrieve his vehicle.
