

POLICE BLOTTER FOR FEB. 1-15, 2021



On February 1st at 7:00 am, Officer Hall contacted a subject in the John Muir Inn parking lot. He conducted a consent search and located a small amount of methamphetamine. He arrested and cite-released the subject at the scene. Case# 21-231.

On February 1st at 9:01 am, officers responded to the 1700 block of Alhambra Avenue for a report of a male breaking into the back of the residence. The suspect fled when the neighbors confronted him.
