



POLICE BLOTTER FOR JUNE 16-30, 2021

On June 16th at 10:42 am, Officer Green was dispatched to the 1200 Morello Avenue (Morello Park Elementary) for a report of a vandalism. Sometime during the night an unknown person(s) spray painted sexually explicit drawing on a building within the campus. Case # 21-1275, Officer Green.

On June 17th at 4:35 pm, Officer Green responded to Quickstop on Muir Road for a hit and run. Case# 21-1283.

On June 17th at 11:39 pm, Officer Ramos responded to the 200 block of Morello Avenue for a non-injury traffic collision. Case# 21-1284.

On June 18th at 5:27 pm, Officer Weems responded to the Shell Gas Station, 3630 Alhambra Avenue for a petty theft case. Case# 21-1294.

On June 19th at 7:24 am, Officer Green responded to the 800 block of Arnold Drive for a grand theft and tampering with a vehicle report.

On June 20th at 7:35 pm, Officer Hall was dispatched to a subject yelling and throwing items in the 800 block of Center Avenue. He contacted the subject and during a consent search Officer Hall located a small amount of methamphetamine. The man was arrested and cite-released. Case# 21-1304.

On June 20th at 8:19 pm, officers were dispatched to the 2000 block of Olympic Drive for two subjects who came to the house and threatened a resident with a firearm. It was determined the man was contacted by two white males, with limited description, and physically struck him and brandished a semi-auto pistol. He was then robbed of approximately \$4000 in cash. On June 21st at 4:06 am, officers were dispatched to an occupied suspicious vehicle at the end of the J Street apartment parking lot. Officer Murray checked the plate and determined it did not match the vehicle. He waited for additional units and detained the man. A check of the vehicle revealed it had been reported stolen out of the city of Concord. The man also had an outstanding warrant for his arrest for vehicle theft and felony evading. He was booked into MDF. Case# 21-1306.

On June 21st at 6:51 am, a business owner reported a theft of property from his commercial moving vehicle from the 800 block of Arnold Drive. The victim stated the theft occurred over the prior weekend (value under \$400.00). Case# 21-1308.

At 8:30 am, a man arrived at the police department for a vehicle release. A records check revealed he had an outstanding "No bail" warrant for Auto Theft. He was arrested without incident and transported to MDF and booked. Case# 21-1289.

At 4:47 pm, officers were dispatched to the 100 block of Fig Tree Lane on a report of a restraining order violation. The suspect is currently outstanding and the investigation continues. Case# 21-1321.

On June 22nd at 12:41 am, officers were dispatched to the area of 855 Howe Road on report of a fire. Upon arrival, it was determined an unoccupied RV parked on Howe Road was fully engulfed in flames which spread to the nearby hillside. CFD arrived on scene and was able to contain the fire prior to reaching any business structures. The RV, nearby hillside, and PGE power lines were damaged as a result of the fire. On June 23rd at 1:45 pm, a man was contacted to the rear of 1170 Arnold Drive, Petco Stores, with other individuals. A records check revealed he had an outstanding misdemeanor warrant. He was arrested and cite released at the scene without incident. Case# 21-1333.

On June 23rd at 7:36 pm, MPD officers were dispatched to the area of Elderwood Drive near Center Avenue for a male who brandished a pistol at the caller and his friend. At the time of the incident the victims were repairing a bicycle on the sidewalk. It is unknown where the white male adult emerged from. The suspect was described as a white male adult, thin build and wearing a Hawaiian type shirt. The suspect confronted the other two white males and pulled up his shirt exposing the pistol, and then angrily told the victims to get out of the area as they did not live there. The victims could not give a direction of flight and the suspect was not located in the area. Officer Hoyles took a case for the brandishing.

On June 25th at 7:15 am, officers were dispatched to Marina Vista and Waterfront Road for two subjects acting suspicious that were associated with a box truck. Officers made contact with both subjects. A wants/warrants check revealed the 31-year-old man of Milpitas had two misdemeanor warrants. He was arrested and released on scene with a new court dates. A consent search of the 52-year-old man of San Jose revealed he was in possession of Methamphetamine and paraphernalia. He was cite released from the scene. Case# 21-1340.

At 10:41 pm, officers responded to the 100 block of Wawona Circle for a report of a court order violation. The man was placed under arrest, transported and booked into MDF. Officer Murray, case# 21-1346.

At 11:58 pm, Officer Weems observed a Nissan Altima #7SWH722 traveling E/B SR4 on W/B lanes near the Alhambra on-ramp. Officer Weems initiated a traffic enforcement stop on the vehicle and contacted a 32-year-old man from Antioch. A DUI investigation was conducted. At the completion of SFST's, the man was found not to be under the influence of alcohol nor controlled substance. He was placed under arrest for reckless driving, transported to the police station for processing and released. Officer Weems, case# 21-1347.

On June 26th at 4:26 am, officers responded to the 1300 block of Arnold Drive for a report of a Hispanic male in all black clothing looking into vehicles. Upon arrival, officers contacted a 24-year-old man from Martinez in the parking lot matching the clothing description. Dispatch advised of a felony warrant for the man out of San Francisco County. He made contact with the driver, a 40-year-old man from Crockett and passenger, a 48-year-old woman from Martinez. Officer Weems's investigation revealed both of them were in possession of controlled substance and drug paraphernalia. They were placed under arrest, cited and released at the scene.
