

POLICE BLOTTER FOR AUGUST 16-31, 2021



On August 16th at 8:41 pm, Officer Bui conducted a suspicious vehicle check at the John Muir Inn. He contacted the solo male occupant and learned he was on probation. He conducted a probation search and located a small amount of methamphetamine. He arrested and cite-released the subject at the scene. Case# 21-1722.

On August 16th at 9:01 pm, officers responded to the grassy area above county hospital for a small brush fire. The fire was extinguished. During a search of the area, Sergeant Espinoza located the responsible male. Arson investigators were called who took over the investigation. The suspect was arrested and booked into county jail. Case# 21-1723.

On August 17th at 7:50 am, Officer Miller responded to the 300 block of Robinson Street. Sometime during the evening, an unknown person slashed the tires on three different vehicles. Case# 21-1725.

On August 22nd at 3:54 pm, officers responded to the 300 block of Thistle Circle for a swatting incident. MPD dispatch received a call from a Google number. The male caller stated a friend was on drugs and shot his friend after brandishing a knife. Officers responded to the home, placed a call inside, and after a protective sweep was done determined only one person was in the home. No force was used on the person in the home, and it was determined to be a prank call.

On August 22nd at 5:21 pm, officers responded to Amtrak for a male passed out in the middle of the street. Officers arrived and believed a possible overdose occurred. They administered Narcan as medical personnel arrived and began life saving measures. The male was pronounced deceased at the scene. Case# 21-1760.

On August 23rd at 11:16 am, officers were dispatched to Starbucks at 6638 Alhambra Avenue for an intentionally set fire. Officer Arone arrived and met with ConFire who determined a suspect started a fire in a small garbage can. During the investigation, Officer Arone was able to obtain a suspect description of a black male, wearing a grey sweatshirt and a blue Sketchers backpack. Officer Arone located the suspect behind Safeway, which is in the same shopping center. The suspect was positively identified as the subject leaving the bathroom before the fire. He was placed under arrest and booked into county jail for arson. ConFire extinguished the fire and damage was limited to the garbage can. No structures were affected. Confire Arson Investigator Moses also responded to the scene and conducted his investigation. Case# 21-1763.

On August 23rd at 7:31 pm, officers were dispatched to the area of Alhambra Avenue and Lindsey Drive on a report of a solo vehicle collision. Upon the officers' arrival, they located power lines going across all lanes of Alhambra Avenue. The driver was not injured and alcohol/drugs were not a factor. PGE responded and were able to restore the power lines. Case# 21-1772.

On August 24th at 10:42 pm, Officer Bui conducted an enforcement stop in the area of Pacheco Boulevard @ Morello Avenue. He contacted the male driver and conducted a consent search. During the search, he located a small amount of methamphetamines. He arrested and cite-released the subject from the scene. Case# 21-1780.
