ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS: Only households that earned less than the qualifying income limits for very low-income families as established by Contra Costa County in 2024, may qualify for a very low-income exemption (the attached table identifies the applicable current HUD income limits). If a full or partial exemption is granted pursuant to this very low-income exemption form, it shall be for the 2025-2026 tax year parcel tax levy only. **Each year, prior to June 15th, a new form must be submitted** and approved in order to qualify for a very low-income exemption for the parcel tax levy for the following tax year. Eligibility requirements are subject to annual review and amendment by the City of Martinez and thus may vary from year-to-year.
